

CITY COUNCIL MEETING
01-18-2023

The City Council of the City of Lineville met in their regular meeting on Wednesday, January 18th, 2023, at 5:00 p.m. at the City Annex Building in Lineville, Alabama, with the following present: Mayor Roy Adamson, Council Members: David Proctor, Rick Coleman, Joseph Appleby, Larry Bishop, and City Clerk Nicholas New, Police Chief Richard Bickerstaff, City Supervisor Rusty Taylor, Court Clerk Jodie McKinney, and Breanna Minter from the Clay Times Journal. Council Member Carolyn Smith was absent.

Mayor Roy Adamson called the meeting to order. Mayor then asked the Council if they had reviewed the minutes from the previous Council meeting. A motion was then made by Council Member Proctor and seconded by Council Member Bishop to approve the minutes from the previous meeting. The vote was unanimous. Next the Mayor asked the Council if they had reviewed the bills to be paid. A motion was made by Council Member Appleby and seconded by Council Member Coleman. The vote was unanimous.

Mayor Adamson welcomes Council Member Rick Coleman to the District 4 seat.

Tiffany Young with the Clay County Chamber of Commerce speaks and updates the Council on all of the upcoming events for 2023.

Next on the agenda was to set the public hearing for the Monte Alban for February 6th at 4:30 P.M. A motion was made by Council Member Appleby and seconded by Council Member Coleman to set this hearing. The vote was unanimous.

Then on the agenda was to accept the resignation of Officer Robert Miller. A motion was made by Council Member Proctor and seconded by Council Member Appleby to accept this resignation. The vote was unanimous. An accompanying motion was made to open this patrol officer position by Council Member Coleman and seconded by Council Member Bishop. The vote was unanimous.

Mayor Adamson mentions that we need to keep the storm victims in the surrounding counties in our thoughts, and thanks the Fire Department for their hard work putting out the recent house fires we have had.

Lastly Council Member Proctor informs the Council that the Park Board will have their annual golf tournament at the Clay County Public Golf Course Saturday, March 25th. Council Member Proctor also mentions that we should remember former Police Chief Sidney Ford's family.

There being no further business a motion to adjourn was made by Council Member Appleby and seconded by Council Member Bishop. The vote was unanimous. The meeting ended at 5:15 P.M.
