

CITY COUNCIL MEETING
7-19-2021

The City Council of the City of Lineville met in their regular meeting on Monday, July 19, 2021, at 5:00 p.m. at the City Annex Building in Lineville, Alabama, with the following present: Mayor Roy Adamson, Council Members: Carolyn Smith, David Proctor, Joseph Appleby, Robert Milstead, Larry Bishop and City Clerk Donna Mathews, Police Chief Richard Bickerstaff, Assistant Clerk Nicholas New, City Supervisor Rusty Taylor, Brianna Minter from the Clay Times Journal.

Mayor called the meeting to order. Mayor asked the Council if they had reviewed the minutes from the previous Council meeting. A motion was then made by Council Member David Proctor and seconded by Council Member Carolyn Smith to approve the minutes from the previous meeting. The vote was unanimous. Next the Mayor asked to Council if they had reviewed the bills to be paid. A motion was then made by Council Member Joseph Appleby and seconded by Council Member Robert Milstead to approve the bills to be paid. The vote was unanimous.

First on the agenda was the alcohol application from Wesley Spivey d/b/a The Farmhouse and Company. City Supervisor Rusty Taylor reported that he and Fire Chief Bill Johnson did the inspections today and it is ready to set for a public hearing at this point. Mayor recommended setting a hearing at 4:30 p.m. on the next meeting date of August 2, 2021. A motion was then made by Council Member David Proctor and seconded by Carolyn Smith. The vote was unanimous.

Mayor reminded everyone that Summer Sizzle is still going on through July each Thursday. City Supervisor Rusty Taylor reminded everyone that soccer signups are July 29, August 3, August 12 each evening from 6-8. Council Member Carolyn Smith said she has been receiving lots of comments on the park and how well it is being taken care of and she thanked Rusty and his crew for the job they do in keeping it looking so good. Council Member David Proctor wanted an update on the buildings downtown. City Supervisor Rusty Taylor said about 2 weeks ago they had hired a new contractor. He will check back with them. Council Member Larry Bishop said he had received a complaint from a citizen about the drainage problem coming off Hann Street onto Oak Grove Road. Rusty said he will take a look at it.

There being no further business, a motion to adjourn was made by Council Member Robert Milstead and seconded by Council Member Larry Bishop. The vote was unanimous. The meeting ended at 5:09 p.m.
