

CITY COUNCIL MEETING
04-01-2024

The City Council of the City of Lineville met in their regular meeting on Monday, April 1st, 2024, at 5:00 p.m. at the City Annex Building in Lineville, Alabama, with the following present: Mayor Roy Adamson, Council Members: Carolyn Smith, David Proctor, Joseph Appleby, Rick Coleman, Larry Bishop, and City Supervisor Rusty Taylor, City Clerk Nicholas New, Police Chief Richard Bickerstaff, Court Clerk Jodie McKinney, and Breanna Minter from the Clay Times Journal.

Mayor Roy Adamson called the meeting to order. Mayor then asked the Council if they had reviewed the minutes from the previous Council meeting. A motion was then made by Council Member Proctor and seconded by Council Member Smith to approve the minutes from the previous meeting. The vote was unanimous. Next the Mayor asked the Council if they had reviewed the bills to be paid. A motion was made by Council Member Appleby and seconded by Council Member Coleman to approve the bills to be paid. The vote was unanimous.

First on the agenda was to approve the 2022-23 Financial Statements. A motion was made by Councilmember Proctor and seconded by Councilmember Bishop to approve the financial statements as presented. The vote was unanimous.

Mayor Adamson mentions that April is child abuse awareness month, and that the pocket park has been decorated with blue ribbons for that. Mayor Adamson also thanks Jimmy Barton for his year of service as a business owner, service in the fire department, and for serving on the industrial board.

City Supervisor Taylor mentions that they will host a softball tournament Saturday with four highschool teams playing. Taylor says that little league games will start April 8th on Monday, Tuesday, and Thursday. Taylor also announces that the City will host the 8u, 10u, and 12u state softball tournaments from June 21st-23rd.

Chief Bickerstaff mentions that the new patrol car is waiting on a prisoner cage and then it will be ready for the road.

Councilmember Proctor reminds the Council that the Park Golf Tournament is Saturday April 6th and that they have 13 teams signed up currently.

There being no further business a motion to adjourn was made by Council Member Bishop and seconded by Council Member Coleman. The vote was unanimous. The Meeting ended at 5:11 p.m.
