

CITY COUNCIL MEETING
01-21-2026

The City Council of the City of Lineville met in their regular meeting on Wednesday, January 21st, 2026, at 5:00 p.m. at the City Annex Building in Lineville, Alabama, with the following present: Mayor Roy Adamson, Council Members: David Proctor, Carolyn Smith, Joseph Appleby, Rick Coleman, Larry Bishop, and City Supervisor Rusty Taylor, Police Chief Richard Bickerstaff, and Court Clerk Jodie McKinney. City Clerk Nicholas New was absent.

Mayor Roy Adamson called the meeting to order. Mayor then asked the Council if they had reviewed the minutes from the previous Council meeting. A motion was then made by Council Member Proctor and seconded by Council Member Smith to approve the minutes from the previous meeting. The vote was unanimous. Next the Mayor asked the Council if they had reviewed the bills to be paid. A motion was made by Council Member Appleby and seconded by Council Member Coleman. The vote was unanimous.

First on the agenda was to approve a change order to Williams Fire Apparatus for the refurbishment of the Pierce Pumper truck. The change order moved the total price from \$109,000.00 to \$120,000.00. The city will pay the original price of \$109,000.00 and the fire department will pay the remaining \$11,000.00. A motion was made by Councilmember Proctor and seconded by Councilmember Bishop to approve the change order. The vote was unanimous.

Last on the agenda was to approve a request to reserve the park from Bobbie Gregg. The event will be on May 24th and it will be a family reunion. A motion was made by Councilmember Proctor and seconded by Councilmember Smith to approve the request. The vote was unanimous.

City Supervisor Taylor mentions that baseball/softball signups will be on February 12th, 14th, and 16th at the City Hall drive thru. Taylor also mentioned that FACS has requested to use 2 fields at the ballpark for their games this year. Taylor said that Central Jr. High will also be using a field.

Chief Bickerstaff mentions that the 2025 Tahoe is being wrapped and equipped and will be on the road soon.

Councilmember Bishop asks if District 5 could use the old baseball field in the district. Supervisor Taylor says that the City no longer owns it. Councilmember Proctor mentions that the Park Board golf tournament will be March 21st.

Mayor Adamson asks the Council to look at the roads in their districts and report back with which ones need to be worked on.

There being no further business a motion to adjourn was made by Council Member Bishop and seconded by Council Member Coleman. The vote was unanimous. The meeting ended at 5:10 p.m.
