

CITY COUNCIL MEETING
04-20-2026

The City Council of the City of Lineville met in their regular meeting on Monday April 20th, 2026, at 5:00 p.m. at the City Annex Building in Lineville, Alabama, with the following present: Mayor Roy Adamson, Council Members: David Proctor, Carolyn Smith, Joseph Appleby, Rick Coleman, Larry Bishop. and City Clerk Nicholas New, Police Chief Richard Bickerstaff, and City Supervisor Rusty Taylor. Court Clerk Jodie McKinney was absent.

Mayor Roy Adamson called the meeting to order. Mayor then asked the Council if they had reviewed the minutes from the previous Council meeting. A motion was then made by Council Member Proctor and seconded by Council Member Smith to approve the minutes from the previous meeting. The vote was unanimous. Next the Mayor asked the Council if they had reviewed the bills to be paid. A motion was made by Council Member Appleby and seconded by Council Member Coleman. The vote was unanimous.

First on the agenda was to approve the fiscal year 2024-25 financial statements. A motion was made by Council Member Bishop and seconded by Council Member Coleman to approve the financial statements. The vote was unanimous.

Next on the agenda was to approve a park reservation for Ricky Cotney for pavilion 2 on June 7th for a family reunion. A motion was made by Council Member Proctor and seconded by Council Member Appleby to approve this reservation. The vote was unanimous.

Last on the agenda was to approve a park reservation for Bobby Fables for pavilion 3 on June 7th for a family reunion. A motion was made by Council Member Proctor and seconded by Council Member Coleman to approve this reservation. The vote was unanimous.

City Supervisor Taylor thanks Chief Bickerstaff, Lineville and Barfield Fire Departments, State DOT, ADEM, Clay County Rescue Squad, Lineville Police Department, Chem-Tec, and East Alabama Commission for their assistance in cleaning up the 18-wheeler wreck on highway 9. Taylor also mentioned that baseball/softball games have started and will continue on Monday, Tuesday, and Thursday nights until May 12th. Taylor also reminded the Council that incredible kids will be held on Saturday mornings at 9:00 A.M. for the next four Saturdays. Chief Bickerstaff echoed Taylor's statement on the 18-wheeler cleanup and mentioned that the driver was okay and is back home now.

There being no further business a motion to adjourn was made by Council Member Bishop and seconded by Council Member Coleman. The vote was unanimous. The meeting ended at 5:12 p.m.
